Please know that no one from the parish office will ask you to make a purchase, or respond to an "urgent need." All correspondence from the office will include specific information as to the nature of the correspondence.

As a best practice, never open any links, give out private information or respond to texts or emails without first checking to see that the source is legitimate.

We invite all women to join us in serving others and growing in faith together!





The wedding at Cana is the story of when Jesus performed His first miracle. He and His mother Mary went to a wedding in a town called Cana. During the celebration, the wine ran out, which was a big problem for the hosts. Mary told Jesus about it, and even though it wasn't yet His time to show that He could perform miracles, she told the servants to do whatever Jesus said.

Jesus then told the servants to fill six big jars with water. After they did, Jesus made the water turn into wine! This was a special sign that showed Jesus' power, and it helped His disciples believe in Him.

This Gospel reading teaches us that Jesus cared about helping others, even with small problems, and that He can do amazing things!
