Resurrection Choir Brings Community, Song, and Reverence to Our Funeral Masses

Death is an inevitable part of the human experience, yet it is accompanied by hardship and heartbreak. As Catholics, we may find comfort in the hope for eternal life as promised to us by Jesus Christ. While the Funeral Mass is a celebration, it can also come with pain for those whose loved ones have moved on to eternal life.

The Resurrection Choir serves the grieving by providing music and community at the funeral Mass, hoping to alleviate some of the heavy burden on the family. The choir sings hymns chosen by the deceased individual's loved ones, providing all the music for the Mass.

"It's simple — no practice or anything," says Jean Nossek, who coordinates the choir members.

The choir serves both Nativity and St. Joseph Parishes. For over 30 years, Jean has been a dedicated member of the funeral choir, showing up to sing whenever her schedule allowed. She took over the coordination in more recent years, calling everyone on her list to notify them of the upcoming funeral.

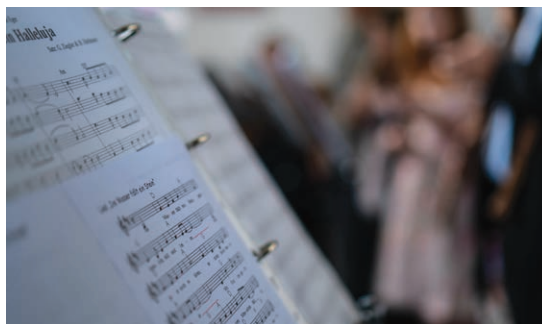
"Then those that can come will, that's what we do," she says. "I have 15 on my list."

Jean, now 85 years old, is among several members who have been involved in the choir for many years. Since there are no rehearsals or outside preparations, they have found it to be a minimal time commitment that's a simple way to give to the community. Jean typically sees between four and 10 members show up for each Mass — she also hopes to recruit new and younger members as the original members are getting older.

"It's not time-consuming at all — it is very easy," she says. "Most of the songs, everyone knows them. There are some new ones, but it's a very simple part of what we can do for the church."

Many of the songs are older classic hymns, such as "How Great Thou Art," "Be

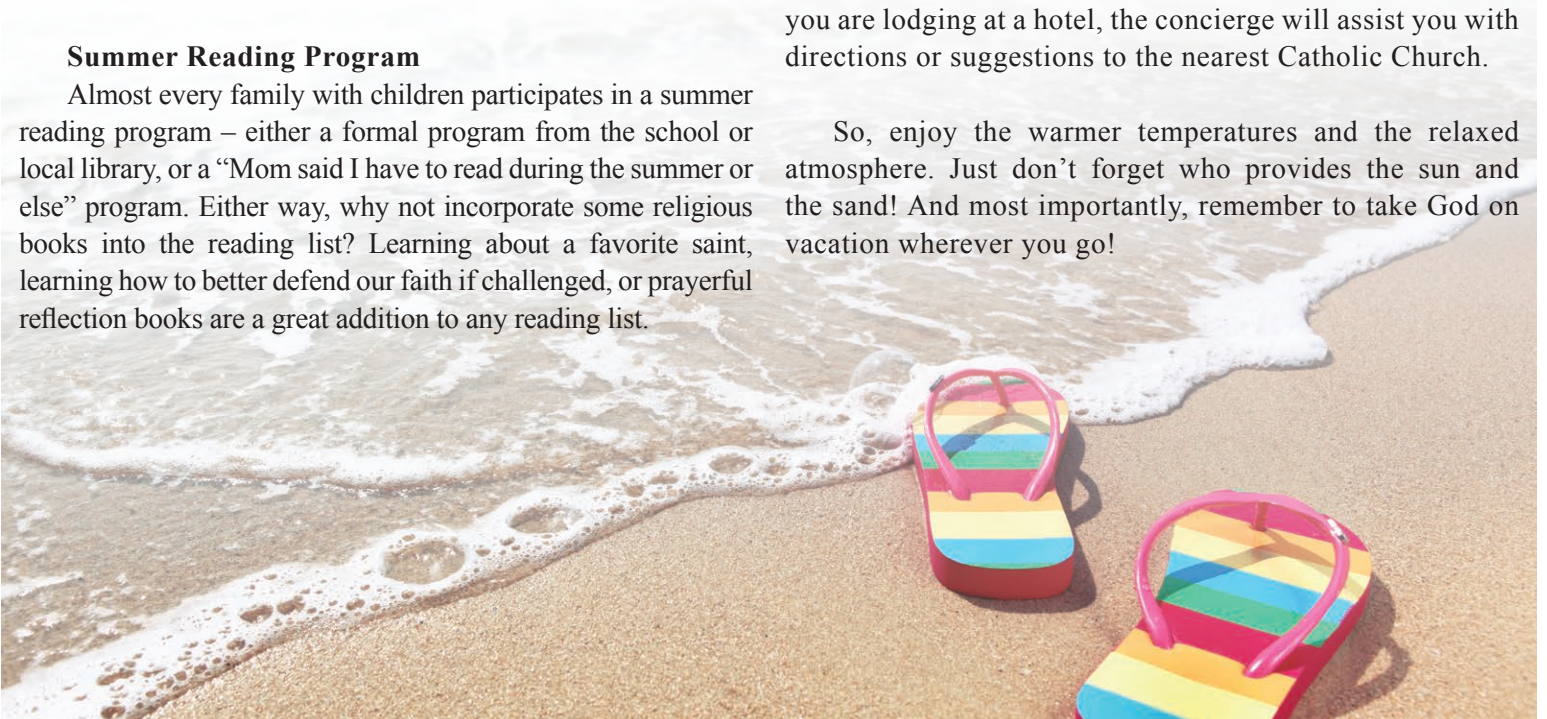
Grill Out with God

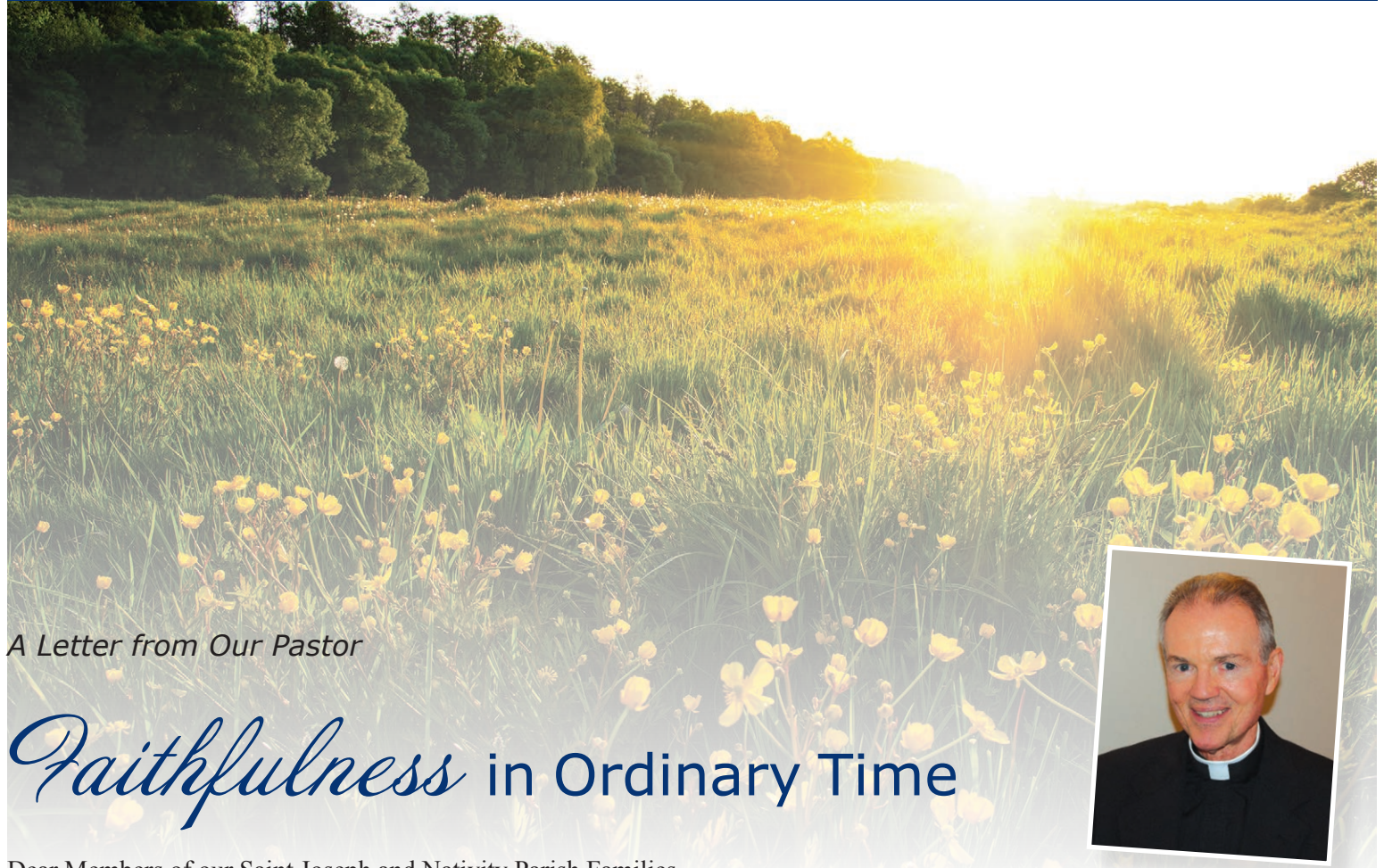
Don't Take a Vacation from Mass

A Letter from Our Pastor

Faithfulness in Ordinary Time

Dear Members of our Saint Joseph and Nativity Parish Families,

The month of July places us firmly within Ordinary Time — a season that, at first glance, can seem quieter than the great celebrations of the Church year. After the richness of Easter and the movement of spring, these summer weeks can feel less structured. But Ordinary Time is anything but unimportant. In many ways, it is where the work of discipleship really takes place.

Without the focus on a single mystery, we are invited to live the fullness of our faith in the ordinary circumstances of daily life. This is where consistency matters. Week after week, we gather for Mass, we make time for prayer, and we try to live the Gospel in the responsibilities and relationships God has given us. These small, steady choices

are what form us over time.

Every summer, it becomes a little easier to drift. Travel, changing schedules, and a different pace of life can gradually pull us away from the habits that keep us grounded. When we recognize that everything we have is a gift from God, we begin to understand that our response must be consistent. Our time, our talents, and our resources are not offered only when it is easy. They are part of a way of life rooted in gratitude and trust.

As we continue through these summer weeks, let us recommit ourselves to the daily practice of our faith. It is in these ordinary moments that God does His quiet work in us, shaping us into the people He is calling us to be.
